

Timeline of the Delta Delta Hazing Investigation

1. **Monday, Mar. 18, 2024:** Six New Members of Alpha Delta Delta were invited to engage in a drinking activity with other members after a weekly Alpha meeting.
2. Later in the night, the New Members were blindfolded and transported to the Berkeley Rose Garden, about 15 minutes North of campus.
3. Upon returning to the Lodge, they were provided with additional alcohol and dropped off in the Kensington area.
4. **Tuesday, Mar. 19, 2024:** Around 1:00 a.m. that night (now Tuesday, Mar. 19, 2024), the Kensington Police Department responded to a disturbance caused by the group of New Members in a residential area.
5. All six were cited for public intoxication and two were transported to a local hospital for mild alcohol-related illnesses.
6. Two actives, including #1 Josh Koe, were dispatched to either bring the four remaining New Members back to the Lodge or to see the hospitalized New Members in person (they were released at 8 a.m. the next day, when Josh Koe brought them back to the Lodge).
7. **Tuesday, Mar. 19th, 2024:** The men of Alpha Delta Delta self-reported the incident to the Chi Psi Central Office, explaining the events in great detail and admitting without pause that they had broken University and Fraternity protocol.
8. **Tuesday, Mar. 19th, 2024:** The University notified the Alpha that they had been placed on an interim suspension following the incident.
9. **Tuesday, Mar. 19th, 2024:** The Director of the Fraternity and Sorority Life Office reached out to the Central Office to set a time to discuss the incident and proposed sanctions.
10. **Wednesday, Mar. 23rd, 2024:** The Executive Council voted to suspend the Alpha.
11. **Friday, Mar. 22nd, 2024:** The Director of the Fraternity and Sorority Life met with Assistant Executive Director Kyle Phillips to discuss the proposed sanctions, indicating the University's intention to remove recognition for 8 years.
12. **Thursday, Mar. 28th, 2024:** The Central Office offered a strict plan that did not include a loss of recognition but did include moving all active members to alumni in good standing status, a rigorous internal review, social probation, reforming the new member education process, and the loss of Lodge privileges for all members. This was done to ensure the Alpha remained active.
13. **Monday, May 20, 2024:** The University officially completed its review of the incident and the Central Office's proposal; they rejected the proposal and handed down the five-year loss of recognition sentence.
14. **Thursday, May 30, 2024:** The undergraduate leadership accepted and signed the proposed resolution plan, which removes the University's recognition for five years.
15. **Saturday, August 3, 2024:** The 183rd Convention will vote to move the Alpha into dormancy.
